

BAC RodRun/Cruise to Walker Honey Farm & Green's Sausage House Nov. 2020

About 30 cruisers in about 16 vehicles enjoyed a comfortable and enjoyable cruise on November 21st to the Walker Honey Farm near Rogers Texas. Cheryl and Harry Green led the route that took back roads pretty much straight north from here toward Temple, and included a lunch stop at the Green Sausage House which had many of the usual café choices as well as a few German style entrées that many of us enjoyed. Tables were somewhat separated and many used masks.

After lunch and a short drive, we arrived at the honey farm where we received a very interesting and extensive discussion on the activity of the farm bees, how they acquire nectar from various types of plants during the year to make different flavors of honey, as well as a walking tour of their facility where they process honey into various honey products, candles, and mead wine.

It was explained to us that mead is a general term for fermented products that are made from honey. Some can resemble a brew or beer product, while in the case of the Walker farm, honey is processed similar to grape juice in that it results in wine of various flavors.

The gift shop had extensive product selections that many cruisers took advantage of for honey and wine purchases, many of which will probably end up in Christmas gifts this season, or on a perfectly browned slice of buttered toast on a crisp morning around Christmas. In fact, I think I just heard the toaster pop, so I will be signing off now.
